Welcome to your **Berinert**® **diary**

This diary has been specially designed for people with hereditary angioedema (HAE), also known as C1-esterase inhibitor deficiency. HAE affects everyone differently depending on the severity of the disease, which means the frequency, type, and timing of attacks can vary from person to person. But you may also find that your own symptoms vary from time to time and at different stages in your life.

So, it can be helpful to use a diary to keep track of any episodes of HAE you experience. In your diary, you can note down any swelling, how severe it is, and where on the body it occurs. There is also space to make a note of your feelings and emotions just before and during any HAE attacks.

If you use treatment to help the swelling go down, you should record this, along with whether this was at home*, at your treatment centre, or at hospital. You may find it easiest to peel off the label for any medication you use and simply stick it on the corresponding date of treatment in your diary.

Taking note of the patterns in your symptoms and treatment can help you to recognise any triggers and make adjustments to your routine to avoid them. It can also be useful when discussing your HAE with your care team.

Why not start by filling in your personal treatment notes on the next page and taking a look at the sample diary page for an example?
